I want to thank Senator Nickel for sponsoring this bill. I appreciate that he believes in our value in helping our students become good readers and is willing to back that belief up action with a bill that calls for increased funding for teacher assistants to work with our K-3 students in reading.

If there is one thing I have learned as I have traveled around our state and met and talked with teacher assistants, it is that they love their jobs! They want to help in their schools whenever and however they are needed. They want to assist their teachers and be members of the educational teams. This bill would put more teacher assistants helping in our elementary schools and make a substantial impact for good for our students.
